Some ideas of items that you could include on your poster are:

- A recipe of a cultural/favourite dish.
- Languages you speak
- Pictures of your country of origin.
- Pictures of traditional costumes or dress.
- A picture of an article of traditional clothing (hat, scarf, belt).
- The words to a cultural/favourite song.
- A map of the world with your country of origin outlined.
- Sports or extracurricular activities that you are involved in outside of school.
- Hobbies or interests.
- A picture of a medal or trophy you received.
- A family tradition
- Places you've lived

Please provide a written description (<u>a small paragraph</u>) as well as a picture for each item you have included.

You can include **<u>anything</u>** you think is relevant to your "identity". You should include at least 7 topics/ideas and be prepared to explain them to the rest of the class.
